TERMS OF REFERENCE

- To ensure that the National Curriculum is delivered and its assessment procedures are carried out in line with the legal framework
- To monitor, review and evaluate the standards of achievement, seek to make continuing improvement and ensure that as far as possible the needs of each individual child is met.
- To be aware of school's strengths and areas for development.
- To nominate governors to School Improvement Plan Actions, to ensure they receive the necessary support and training in their roles, and report back to governing body via headteacher.
- To liaise, consult with and provide information to parents and the community on matters relating to the curriculum as necessary, including the home-school agreement.
- To plan, monitor and evaluate school improvement plan areas delegate to (or working party) review the following school's policies
 - Curriculum
 - Learning and Teaching
 - Relationships, Health and Sex Education (RHSE)
 - Provision for RE and Collective Worship
 - Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Report (SEND)
 - Gifted and Talented
- To ensure curriculum is accessible to all pupils
- To monitor Key Stage results
- To know of, monitor and evaluate extra-curricular activities
- To ensure that there is a regular review of the charging and remissions policy
- To keep updated on changes/progress in educational strategies
